Chief of Police, Brant Hromadka, explained that this resolution allows for the Police and Fire departments to enter into a year long contract with the Association for Individual Development (AID) which provides crisis intervention, counseling, advocacy, and follow up support for residents who are experiencing trauma, mental health crisis, domestic violence, substance use challenges, and other significant life events. This contract provides a full time, on site victim services case manager dedicated to Romeoville with 24/7 on call availability for both police and fire service calls. This service is paid entirely through the Opioid Settlement fund.

Mayor Noak explained that this is in addition to the social worker that has been on staff for many years.
