## A Resolution to Waive the Bid Process and Utilize the State Bid Contract for the Supplying of Bulk Rock Salt for the Roadway deicing.

**Whereas**, pursuant to the provisions of 65 ILCS 5/8-9-1 and the provisions of the Village Ordinance No. 2793-00, the Village of Romeoville may vote by 2/3 of its Trustees then holding office to waive the requirements for public bidding on Village public work, or improvement projects; and,

Whereas, the expenditures for the supplying of bulk rock salt for road salt shall be included in the Fiscal Year 2020/21 Budget; and,

**Whereas**, the Village will be utilizing the State Bid Contract for the supplying of bulk rock salt for the roadway salt from Cargill Salt, at the unit prices of \$44.37/ton.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE VILLAGE OF ROMEOVILLE, WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1: <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>: The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Resolution as if fully set forth herein.
- Section 2: <u>Waiver of Public Bid Requirements</u>: Pursuant to the provisions of 65 ILCS 5/8-9-1 and the provisions of the Village Ordinance No. 2793-00 the Village hereby waives the public bidding requirements otherwise applicable and will utilize the State Bid Contract for the supplying of bulk rock salt for road salt from Cargill Salt at the unit price of \$44.37/ton.
- Section 3: <u>Repealer</u>: All other Ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Village of Romeoville that are inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.
- Section 4: <u>Severability</u>: In the event any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, provision, or section of this Resolution or any portion thereof shall be held to be unconstitutional, unenforceable, or void, the same shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections thereof.
- Section 5: Effective Date: The resolution shall take effect after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form, as provided by law.
